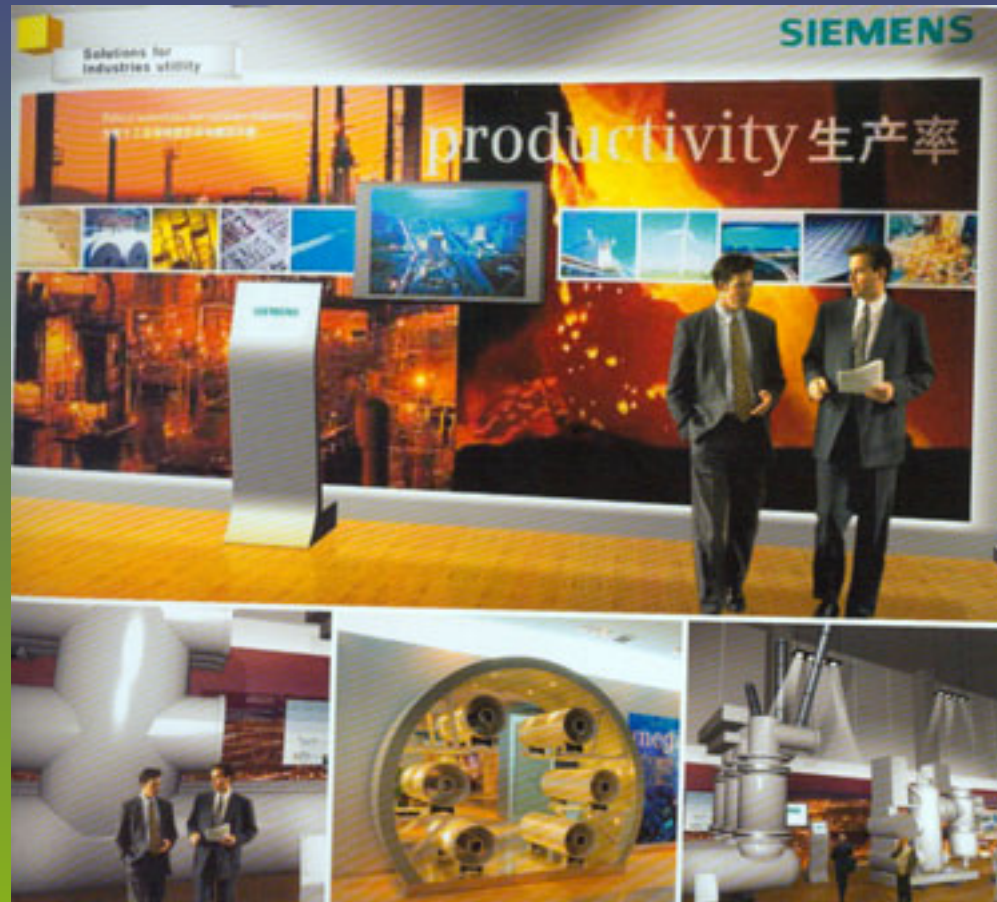
This dramatic focal point was created using both color print and direct to board then backlit.
